

## School Uniform

The Governing Council with parent/caregiver, student and staff representatives sets the uniform policy. It is expected that all students will wear the school uniform every day.



If students cannot wear the school uniform on a particular day then they are required to have a written explanation in their diary for that day (and each following day).

Students not wearing the school uniform will not have access to the ovals and basketball courts at recess and lunchtimes. This is because staff members on yard duty have a responsibility to watch out for uninvited visitors to the school and cannot identify every student personally as belonging to the school, especially from a distance.

Students who come to school out of uniform without a written explanation receive a yard duty and diary note.

The school uniform is defined by items chosen from:

- Para Hills High School navy or white polo shirt or skivvy or Year 12/13 polo top (several styles of polo shirts are available and can be purchased from the school).
- Para Hills High School windcheater/jacket or Year 12/13 top or plain navy blue windcheater (several styles of windcheaters are available and can be purchased from the school).
- Plain navy blue pants/slacks, shorts or skirt. (Navy blue skirt available from the school).
- Para Hills High School dress can be worn although this is not easily available from uniform shops.

### **Please note:**

Clothing that displays a commercial logo or brand name that is greater than 5cm are

### **NOT permitted**

ALL JACKETS MUST BE PLAIN NAVY OR DARK BLUE and be removed when inside the classrooms.

It is strongly recommended that all students have headwear, preferably in dark blue or navy, which gives adequate protection from the sun to the face, neck and ears.

The PE Uniform consists of:

- A change of top (plain white or navy) and appropriate shorts/skirt or pants for physical education
- Appropriate footwear (joggers/sandshoes)
- Appropriate sun protection (hats and sun screen)
